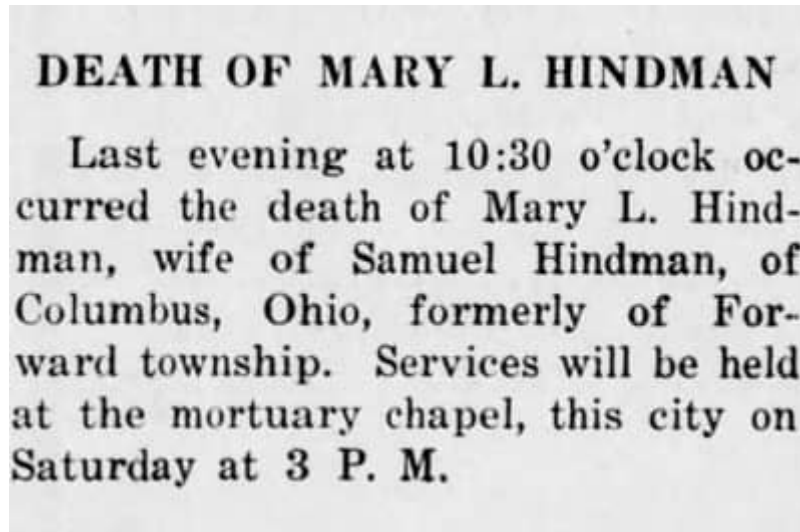

Recollections of the Past.

From the Elizabeth Herald.

On my way a few days ago, to visit the home of of my childhood, I stepped from the train at a way station, Sunny Side by name, on the Monongahela. I stood gazing for a moment on the hills around, when recollections of my childhood days came crowding thick and fast o'er my memory.

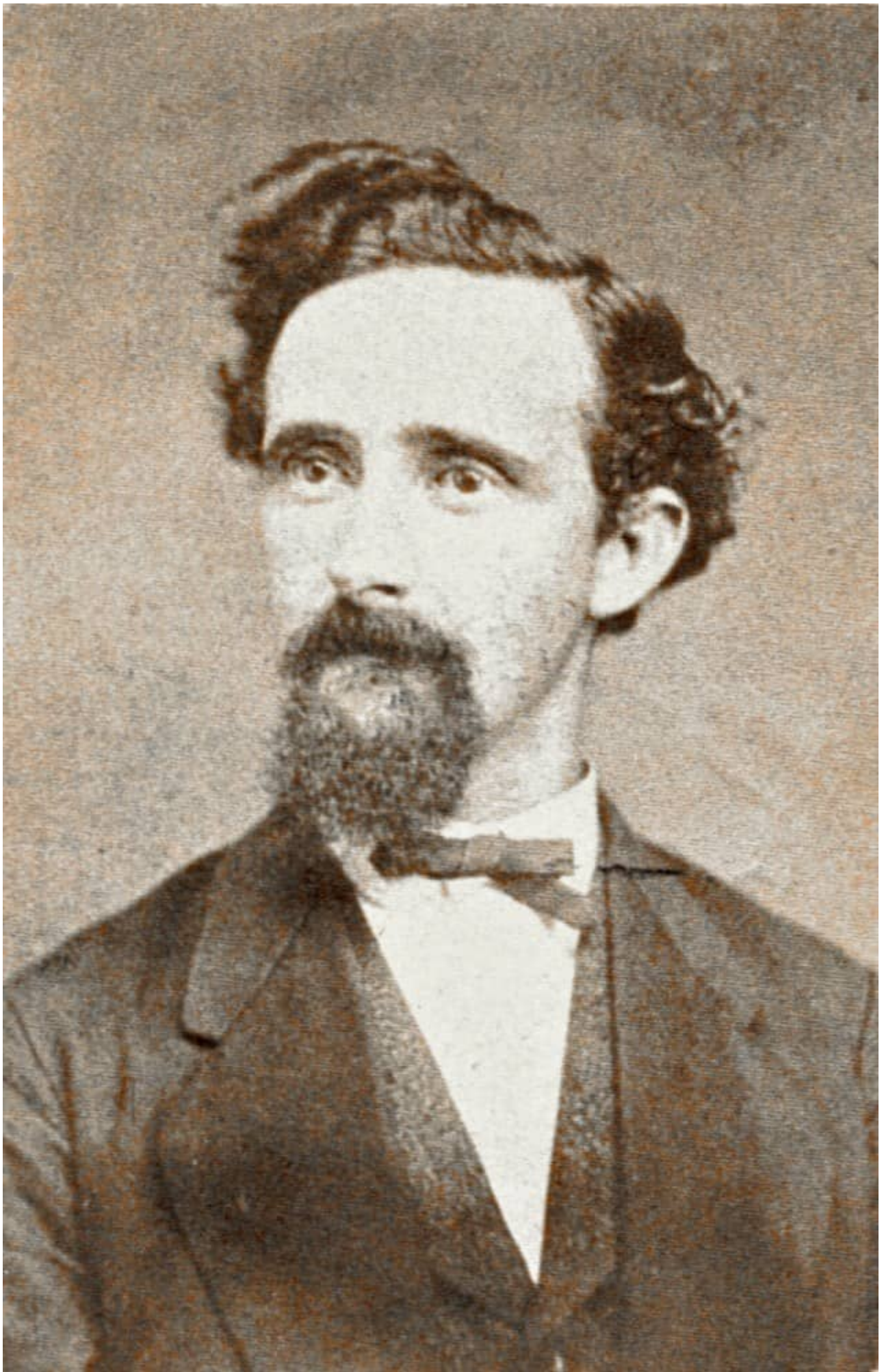
On the ground used as a station, once stood the house owned and occupied by David Allen, his wife and eight children, there being a large yard between the house and river. Now all is gone. Nothing remains to tell the tale, but one old quince tree and a pear tree. The water has even washed the land away, till there is just room for two railroad tracks side by side. The father and mother and one daughter have gone to the home beyond. Three are in the far west, one in Fayette City, one in Monongahela, one in Braddock and one in Mount Washington.

As I passed on my way I came to the farm once owned by Joseph Wall and wife, they having a family of twelve children. Now father, mother and ten children are all sleeping their last sleep. Two daughters remain, Mrs. Bentley, now living on the old farm, and Mrs. Dr. Linn, of Monongahela.

William and his wife Margaret Hindman/Bennie had four children, one of which, Mildred Willis Hindman, became the first woman to become a WAC ([Women's Army Corps](#)) in World War II.

First WAC Dies Sunday At Nelsonville

Miss Mildred W. Hindman, 67, the first woman to become a WAC during World War II, was found dead at 9:30 a.m. Sunday at her Nelsonville Rt. 2 home.

Bill Lewis, a neighbor, told the Hocking sheriff's department Miss Hindman had complained of chest pains the previous night, but refused to see a doctor.

Miss Hindman, a retired major, served in the Women's Army Corps for 12 years and earned eight ribbons, being personally decorated by the late Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower. She took part in the Battle of the Bulge.

She is survived by two brothers, Donald and Robert Hindman, both of Columbus, and a sister Mrs. Harold Collins of Sedona, Ariz.

Funeral arrangements are being made by the Shaw-Davis North Chapel of Columbus.
